## **Reflections**

The sort of men who now live cannot stand anything so strong as the Christianity of the New Testament, (they would die of it or lose their minds), just in the same sense that children cannot stand drink, for which we prepare them a little lemonade--and official Christianity is lemonade-twaddle for the sort of beings that are now called men. It is the strongest thing they stand, and this twaddle then is their language they call "Christianity," just as children call their lemonade "wine."

Søren Kierkegaard (1813-1855) Danish Philosopher and Theologian

(The Greek philosopher Celsus attacks the Christian church in 177 A.D.)

- "...the following are the rules laid down by them. Let no one come to us who has been instructed, or who is wise or prudent (for such qualifications are deemed evil by us); but if there be any ignorant, or unintelligent, or uninstructed, or foolish persons, let them come with confidence. By which words, acknowledging that such individuals are worthy of their God, they manifestly show that they desire and are able to gain over only the silly, and the mean, and the stupid, with women and children."
- "....only foolish and low individuals, and persons devoid of perception, and slaves, and women, and children, of whom the teachers of the divine word wish to make converts."



Leader: Thanks be to God. May the peace of Christ be with you all.



Affirmation of Faith Adapted from *The Westminster Confession* XXV: Of the Church

Leader: What do you believe concerning the invisible church?

People: The catholic or universal Church, which is invisible, consists of the

whole number of God's chosen people, who have been, are, or will be gathered into one under Christ the Head of the Church. It is the spouse,

the body, and the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Leader: What do you believe concerning the visible church?

People: The visible Church, which is also catholic or universal under the Gospel

(though not confined to one nation, as before under the Law), consists of all those throughout the world who profess the true religion, and their children. It is the kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ, the house and family of God, outside of which there is no ordinary possibility of

salvation.

Leader: What do you believe regarding Christ's gifts to the church?

People: Christ has given to this catholic, visible Church the ministry, oracles,

and ordinances of God, for the gathering and perfecting of the saints in this life, up to the end of the world. He makes them effective for these

purposes by his own presence and Spirit, according to his promise.

Leader: What do you believe regarding the purity of the church?

People: This catholic Church has been sometimes more and sometimes less

visible. Also, particular Churches are more or less pure based on whether the doctrine of the Gospel is taught and embraced, the ordinances administered, and public worship is performed more or less

purely in them.




